

Colour in picture

Key Stage 1 (5-7 years)

This fun task is linked to elements of the National Curriculum:
Personal Social Health Education (PSD and PSE).

Learning outcomes

- Make connections and see relationships
- Understand what a Macmillan nurse does

Preparing for the activity

You will need

- A photocopy of the activity sheet for each pupil
- Colouring pencils, crayons or pens
- To know how Macmillan Cancer Relief helps people living with cancer (read about Macmillan in the 'Getting involved' section of this website)

What to do

Spend time looking at the picture with your pupils, naming the images they can see.

When the word hospital is mentioned, you can talk about why people may go to the hospital and who are the typical types of people found at a hospital, such as doctors and nurses. This is where you can introduce the name/type of nurse, called a Macmillan nurse, describing what she does. This is also an opportunity to mention the word cancer as a type of illness. Go over these descriptions, including relevant things that have come out of your discussion with your pupils.

This will reinforce the connections and relationships that have been highlighted.

The pupils can then complete the activity by colouring the picture.
